Make a pop-up card


Show someone they're special by making them a stand-out card.

On 15 June it's Father's Day and on 18 June it's Thank a Teacher Day, and a card is a lovely way to thank someone for all they do for you. Find out how to craft a pop-up card to give your father, carer, teacher or to someone for their birthday.

The idea is to make a card that looks brilliant and is personal. There are two ways to do it. The first is a single popup fold. The second has three sections but you could do two or four. You can add cut-out letters to your pop-up. Keep it simple with "Dad", "Thank you" or "Happy Birthday", or add pictures of their favourite things – or both. Decorate it with colourful pens and outline shapes and letters in a thick black pen to help them stand out.

What you need

- A4 card
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Felt pens, highlighters. crayons
- Glue



TOP TIP

To stick a letter or picture on your pop-up strip, fold it so it creases like the folds on the card. Check that your card opens and closes.



Fold the A4 card in half. Draw 2 lines, 8cm long and 5cm apart, out from the folded edge.



Cut along the lines, fold the middle section over and press to crease, then fold back again.



Open the card and bend the strip so it pops up. Decorate and glue on your cut-out letters.



Fold the A4 card. Draw 3 lines, 8cm, 6cm and 4cm long and 6cm apart, from the fold edge.



Cut along the 3 lines and fold each section over. Press to make a crease, then fold back.



Open the card and bend the 3 folded sections out from the middle. Glue on your cut-outs.
