

## How to...



Display your photos in a colourful way.

Make a rainbow picture holder

his project is a great way of displaying notes, reminders and photos in a way that really stands out. It makes a thoughtful present and will brighten and tidy up your desk. Rainbows appear in the sky when it's sunny and raining at the same time and they are often used as a sign of hope and inclusion.

## What you need

- A small plate to draw around
- Cardboard (from an old box)
- Pen
- Wooden pegs
- Scissors
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- PVA glue
- Glue spreader



Take care when





Put the plate halfway onto one of the edges of a big piece of cardboard. Draw around it with a pen to create a semicircle.



Measure the length of one of the pegs, then draw another semicircle above the first, a peg's length distance away.



Cut along the two curved miles.
Keep the small semicircle piece Cut along the two curved lines. of cardboard from inside your rainbow – this will be the stand.



Paint the curved cardboard shape. White works well but you could paint it gold or any colour you like. Leave it to dry.



Telegraphic Starting at one end, use glue to stick the pegs to the cardboard curve with their pinching ends pointing outwards. Leave to dry.

Paint the pegs in stripes, starting with purple on the inside of the curve and finishing with red on the outside. Leave to dry.



Take the cardboard semicircle and cut it in half. Then cut a slight angle off each piece – this will stop the rainbow from tipping forward.



Use glue to stick the two pieces to the back of the rainbow. Clip your photos and notes into the pegs and enjoy!
