

The daffodil is the national flower of Wales and is associated with St David's Day (St David is the patron saint of Wales), which takes place on 1 March. They are also a symbol of spring and hope. The flowers come in all sorts of shapes and shades, so why not make a mixed bunch of spring blooms to put in a vase and brighten your room.

What you need

- Ruler
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Bright yellow, pale yellow and green crepe or tissue paper
- Double-sided tape or glue
- Green paper straws



Cut out a piece of bright yellow paper 5cm x 5cm. Cut a series of slits halfway down it.




Use double-sided tape to stick it

around the top of the straw. This

Cut out six petals from the pale yellow paper.



Cut out a piece of bright yellow paper about 5cm x 10cm, and make one of the edges wavy.



Use double-sided tape to stick this into a tube shape.



Use tape to stick three petals evenly round the flower's centre. Fill the gaps with the other three.



Cut green paper leaves and stick onto the straw. Bend it like a real daffodil head. Now, make lots more!
