Make Jubilee bunting

Bunting is popular for street parties and events, and the upcoming Queen's Jubilee celebrations will be no exception. Create this cool-multicoloured version with sections based on the UK flag. You can draw your own designs on the flags or use this collage technique to make it even more special. What you need

- White paper or thin white card
- Coloured paper, patterned paper, gift wrap
- Glue stick
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Hole punch
- String

TOP TIPS

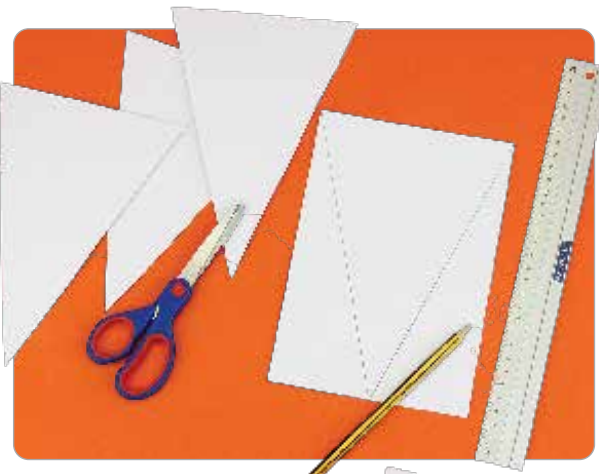
- Try making a patchwork effect design with overlapping strips of wrapping paper or cut out magazine pictures.
- Glue small pieces of torn coloured paper to make spots or strips with an uneven edge.
- Try painting textures with a sponge or a piece of bubble wrap.



You can hang your bunting anywhere.

WARNING!
Always be careful when using sharp scissors.

1 Draw a triangle shape onto A5 size white paper or thin card then cut it out. Cut out more triangles until you have enough for a string of bunting.



2 Cut some pieces of coloured paper or patterned wrapping paper to decorate the flags, or try drawing or printing your own patterns.



3 Cut strips from the patterned papers. Glue them onto the flags then trim around the edges. Try different colour combinations to vary the designs.



4 Punch two holes in the corners of each flag then thread onto a long piece of string, or fix the flags on to string with sticky tape. Then hang them up.
