Make a Halloween wreath

FANCY HAT

Wreaths date back at least 2,800 years. Important people in ancient Greece wore them on their heads.

TOP TIPS

- To make a stronger background, glue two plates together before you cut out the border.
- Add a cardboard tree or branch across the wreath for an extra-spooky effect.

Hang your wreath on a door or in a window.

What you need

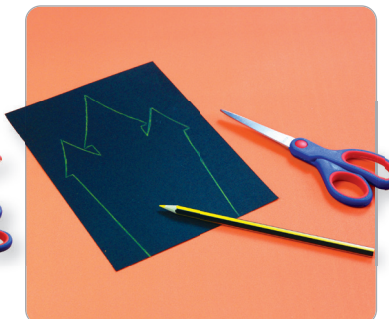
- Cardboard plate
- Coloured card and paper
- A ruler
- Glue
- Scissors
- String or ribbon
- A pencil

If you are planning a party, or you want to let trick-or-treaters know you're celebrating Halloween, hang a homemade wreath on your door or in a window. It is easy to make and

you can change the design to suit anything. We have made an autumn one and some Halloween designs – go wild! Do send photos of yours to hello@theweekjunior.co.uk



1 Take your paper plate. This will make the circle of the wreath. Measure a 3cm border from the outside edge of the plate and cut out a ring. Glue the ends together.



2 Draw a Halloween design onto different card and cut it out. You could try a haunted house, an owl or a pumpkin. Use pale colours to draw on black card.



3 Cut out small pieces of coloured card as decoration and details and glue them into place. Cut out more shapes for the wreath and stick them onto the background.



4 Fix any large cut-out shapes to the edges so they don't flop. Finally, attach a loop of string or ribbon with glue or sticky tape to the top of the wreath to hang it up.
