Create cute bunny baubles

On 22 January it's the start of the Chinese New Year, and for 2023 it marks the start of the Year of the Rabbit. There are 12 animal signs in the Chinese zodiac, each one with its own characteristics. People born in the Year of The Rabbit are believed to be clever, have lots of ideas and are vigilant (watching out for danger).

Traditional New Year decorations are often red because in Chinese culture red is associated with good luck, good fortune and happiness. Decorations often feature the animal of the year or other Chinese symbols of good luck, such as gold coins and lanterns. Join in with the celebrations by turning a room into a "hoppy" place with these fun baubles.

What you need

- Red card
- White card
- Ruler
- Pencil

TOP TIP

Use a cup or small bowl as a guide when you are drawing the circles.





Draw rabbit heads

One sixth of the world's

population will celebrate

Chinese New Year,

with festivities lasting

for 15 days

Take four pieces of card that are 10cm long and 12cm wide. Fold one piece in half. Draw half a rabbit head on it and cut it out. Draw around the shape onto the other pieces of card so you have four rabbit heads.

Add detail

Draw a face on each head shape with felt-tip pens and decorate the body with colours or shapes

cut out of card. Glue a head onto each of the four sections of the bauble. Press along the folds and check that the heads match up. Glue them on.



Glue the circles

Using your glue, stick the folded circles into a stack, one section at a time. Check that the shapes fit neatly on top of each other with the folded edges lined up. Leave them to dry.


