Glistening sea glass
Find these smooth, glass pebbles on UK beaches.

Nature's armour
Find something with a tough outer shell – a beetle, a spiky conker case, or a crab.

Natural spiral
Look closely and you might spot a spiral in a coiled snail shell, a curly fiddlehead fern or a sunflower head.

Shapeshifting cloud
A cloud that looks like something completely different.

Woodland umbrella
Find a mushroom that looks like it could keep a tiny creature completely dry in a rainstorm.

Camouflaged critter
Spot an insect or small creature that blends in perfectly with its surroundings.

Twisted twig
Search for a fallen twig or branch that has grown in a twisted, spiral, or zigzag shape.

An animal's front door
Look for signs of where an animal lives, such as a hole in a tree or an ant nest.

Shimmering rainbow
Can you spot shimmering rainbows on a beetle's back or on a butterfly's wing?

Flying animal
Look up! Can you spot a dragonfly zipping past, a fluttering butterfly or diving, dancing swifts at sunset?

RESPECT NATURE

- Dress for the weather and take spare clothes to keep warm, safe and dry.
